





***The wolves of Willoughby Chase* / by Joan Aiken**

Two young girls are left in the care of a sinister governess in this humorous horror story of an alternate 18th-century England and find adventure amid a background of myth and mystery.




***In the forests of the night* / Amelia Atwater-Rhodes**

Soon after the arrival of cousin Julia, insidious occurrences begin that convince Rachel she is a witch and must be stopped before her total monstrous plan can be effected.




***Coraline* / Neil Gaiman**


Dracula / Bram Stoker ; abridged by Jo Fletcher-Watson




Never trust a dead man / Vivian Vande Velde
