Brain Research: Middle and High School (April-May)

You are invited to attend workshops that will address your child's social, emotional, cognitive, and physical questions about adolescence in middle school or high school. A one-stop place to get your questions answered that go beyond scheduling of classes, electives, and homework. This workshop will be the pre-cursor to a **Transition** workshop.

Topics to be covered in this highly motivating workshop:

- **Social, cognitive, emotional, and physical changes that adolescents experience**
- **Brain research that explains changes in middle and high school teens**

Common Core Workshops (January-March)

Calling all Parents!! If you haven't quite figured out your child's Common Core standards in English Language Arts and Math, this is the workshop for you! Come and learn about the instructional shifts with Common Core in ELA and MATH and concepts like the top 8 mathematical practices.

Early Learning – Parents Are Teachers Too! (PATT) (March)

You are your child's first and most important teacher. Come and bring your 2-4 year old with you to learn some important developmental milestones during this age period and how to make learning at home fun, yet productive. This class will give you the tools to prepare your child for entering the more formal school setting. For parents and toddlers together.

Family Stories (January–February)

This effective interactive parent program is designed to build early college awareness by exploring the cultural and familial situations that arise with families. By telling the story of one family's journey from middle school to college, Graciela's Dream introduces families to the college-going process and demonstrates how to turn the dream of college into a reality.

Kindergarten Parent Academy, Part 2 (April)

Come and join us in a very informative, fun three-week academy that addresses "what are they doing now in Kindergarten?" This workshop begins in April and helps you figure out if your child is on the road to a successful first grade and if not, what can you do **NOW** to support their learning.

Kindergarten Readiness Academy (May)

In May, parents bring your upcoming Kindergarten to this introduction to Kindergarten! The topics covered will be Kindergarten Readiness, Navigating the School, Listening/Speaking/Reading/Writing, and MATH. This four-week academy is highly engaging for parent and child together!

Second Grade – Parents Are Teachers Too! (PATT) (February)

Come and join us in a very informative, fun four-week academy that addresses Second Grade developmental milestones, state standards in ELA and Math, learning styles, and tip and tricks for engaging young children in learning at home ideas. We will also go over the new 2nd Grade report cards and assessments.

Struggling Readers (January –February)

This set of workshops will be broken into two sections, Struggling Readers, Kindergarten through 3rd grade, and Struggling Readers, 4th-6th. Learning to read is one of the hardest tasks for children to master. Some children just can't make "sense" of the "scribbles on the page" and turn that into fluent reading. These classes will be offered in three-week segments to give you tools to work on at home with your child to support their learning to read and reading to learn.

Struggling Writers (March)

Just as children struggle to read, they struggle to write. Writing is a very complex and complicated task for children to master. Please come and join us in this four-week series on supporting your child in learning how to write, and the writing process.

Transitions (April – May)

For most children, transitions can be challenging. Going from third to fourth grade, transitioning from elementary school to middle school and finally taking that step into high school.
