School Resource Officers provide information, tips on dealing with issues facing youth

Parents attending Chino Valley Unified School District's Parent Information Forum on March 22 at Ayala High in Chino Hills had so many questions about issues facing students that they stayed well beyond the program's 90-minute format.

Chino Police Officers and San Bernardino County Sheriff's Deputies of the Chino Hills Police Department who also serve as CVUSD School Resource Officers spoke to the 142 parents on current drug trends among students, social media issues, provisional driver's license laws, curfew requirements, truancy, and parents' rights and responsibilities.

The School Resource Officers provided website links and phone numbers, as well as social media tips that could be helpful to parents dealing with youth issues.

The School Resource Officers present at the meeting and their schools are Chino Police Officer Dustin Kato (Don Lugo High), Sheriff's Deputy Noel Negron of the Chino Hills Police Department (Chino Hills High), Chino Police Officer Robert Troncoso (Buena Vista Continuation High), Sheriff's Deputy Marlene Thompson of the Chino Hills Police Department (Ayala High), and John Cervantes (Magnolia and Ramona junior high schools).
