

Update on Water Quality Assessment at Chino Valley Unified School District March 18, 2014

The District's consulting firm, Ardent Environmental, has recommended the replacement of 157 fixtures/faucets/drinking fountains to address the locations that still indicate an elevated level of lead and/or copper following a third round of testing. The District is in the process of ordering the fixtures and the goal is to have them installed over spring break. Once the installation is complete, the water from a percentage of the new fixtures will be sampled and tested. If the test results indicate acceptable levels of lead and copper, the project will be considered complete with further monitoring and testing to be scheduled at selected schools on an annual but rotating basis. Should the test results indicate anything other than acceptable levels, the District will proceed with other repair plans per the consultant's recommendation and bottled water will continue to be provided to the affected school sites.
