Kindergarten is committed to regular two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways parents and teachers communicate all year are:

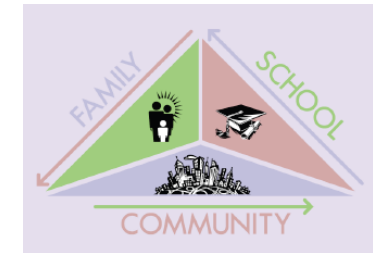

District Goals
