

Local Control Accountability Plan for the Students, Staff and Families of the Chino Valley Unified School District

The Chino Valley Unified School District (CVUSD) is required to develop a Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) to enhance student achievement with an emphasis on actions and services to three specific groups: English learners, students from low income households and foster youth. Beginning in October 2013, CVUSD provided multiple opportunities toward stakeholder input for the LCAP through meetings with students, parents, teachers, support staff, and administration; online surveys; Think Tank meetings represented by teachers' and classified unions, site principals, and district leadership; Parent Advisory Committee and parent District English Advisory Committee (DELAC) meetings; and a Board Study Session.

The LCAP addresses the required eight state priorities (Basic services, Implementation of State Standards, Course Access, Student Achievement, Other Student Outcomes, Student Engagement, Parental Involvement, and School Climate) for all students utilizing multiple funding sources. Additionally, CVUSD is expected to receive approximately \$8.1 million in supplemental grants to fund actions and services targeted for English learners, students from low income households, and foster youth.

Highlights of the Actions and Services of the LCAP

- **Class Size Reduction (CSR)** – The state is funding CSR in stages, and the District is implementing the reduction in accordance with the state's funding formula. The class size ratio will be reduced to 27:1 in Kindergarten through the 3rd grade beginning in August, 2014.
- **Intervention** – A multi-tiered system of academic and behavioral support to students will be implemented through the hiring of intervention teachers at all school sites.
- **Linked Learning** – High School students will have the choice of participating in an academy which provides a college and career pathway through hands on experiences.
- **Staff Development** – In concert with the district's professional development plan, Intervention Specialists will assist school site staff in the implementation of 21st Century Education.
- **Bilingual Clerk** – Additional school office staff will be hired at schools with more than 15% of their student population speaking a language other than English.
- **Community Outreach** – Parent and family programs will be expanded to increase participation and engagement.
- **Parent Training Program** – Training programs will assist parents in navigating their child's educational career.
- **Summer School Jumpstart** – English Learners will have a jump start to the new school year through participation in summer programs.
- **Technology** – Technology improvements will include infrastructure updates, wireless capability expansion, construction of new computer labs, computer acquisitions, and the enhancement of the district website for improved stakeholder communication.
- **School Site Supplies** – Additional funds will be allocated to school sites for supplies.
