

Students will be able to redeem points to purchase DESK PETS!






How does my student earn a Desk Pet?






It is important that each student completes his/her classwork. If classwork is not finished in the time allotted, the student will have to complete it during recess or at home. Please check your child's take home folder daily.




- Birthdays' will be celebrated in class with a birthday song and dance as well as a class birthday letter book.


