The PBIS system will be used in my classroom:

Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) at Briggs is designed to ensure that each student has the opportunity to learn in a safe and secure environment.

Students not following these expectations, will have behavior documented on Incident Logs. Teachers follow up with parents within 24-48 hours after the incident occurs and is recorded on the log. If a student accumulates 4 Incident Logs, a Minor Incident referral form and the logs will be given to an Administrator. From there, Administration follows progressive discipline and will communicate with the teacher and parent within 24 hours. Panther Perks Incentive System
