How are Title I Schools Identified?

- Schools enrolling at least 35% of children from Socio-Economic Disadvantaged (SED) families are eligible to receive Title I funds.
- Schools enrolling at least 40% of children from Socio-Economic Disadvantaged (SED) families are eligible to implement a Title I schoolwide program designed to improved the entire educational program to improve achievement for all students, particularly the lowest-achieving students.
- Free and Reduced Lunch applications are important.

- Measure student progress to determine the success of the Title I program for each student.

- Classroom Performance
 - Performing below grade level expectations
- Other
 - Homeless, Foster Youth, Teacher Recommendation K-6, Attendance

Title I Program Opportunities

- Targeted Intervention during the instructional day for all students (WIN Time)
- Bilingual Instructional Aide (Cynthia Villarreal)
- Bilingual Community Liaison (Francis Ramos)
- Additional teaching materials & technology to supplement a student's regular instruction

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What Parents & Families Can Do

- Serve on a Decision-Making Committee (SSC & ELAC)
- Volunteer at school (PTA, PFLN, classroom)
- Attend ALL school activities (Back to School Night, Open House, Conferences, Assemblies, Family Events, etc.)
- Make sure your child attends school everyday and is on time.
- Encourage and require your child to complete all class work and homework.
- Show a positive attitude about the importance of school and talk about what your child is learning at school.
- Communicate with & support your child's teacher to ensure success.
