### **Accreditation:**

Chino Hills High is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

Founded in 2001, Chino Hills High School is a four-year comprehensive high school in the Chino Valley Unified School District. With a population of 82,800, the City of Chino Hills encompasses 46 miles in Southwestern San Bernardino County. Chino Hills is uniquely located at the junction of four Southern California Counties- Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino.

**School:** Chino Hills High School has a current enrollment of 2,813 students and a teaching staff of 127. The administrative staff consists of a principal and three assistant principals. We have six academic counselors, two intervention counselor and two psychologists who all hold masters' degrees.

**Calendar:** Two 18-week semester grading periods; five days per week; six one hour and 2 minute periods

**School District:** Chino Valley Unified School District is comprised of 19 elementary schools, two fundamental schools; one K-6 and K-8, five junior high school (7-8), four comprehensive high schools, one alternative high school, Independent Study and Virtual Programs at all the comprehensive high schools, and a learning academy.

### **Graduation Requirements:**

- 225 Credits (1 semester class=5 Credits)
  - 4 years English
  - 3 years History/ Social Science
  - 2 years Science
  - 3 years Math
  - 2 years P.E
  - 2 years Fine Arts of World Language
  - Health (5 Credits)
  - Electives (60 Credits)
- 2.0 minimum GPA
- To receive credit for a class, a student must receive a minimum grade of D- in that class.
- Grades are converted to a 4-point scale: A = 4.0, B = 3.0, C = 2.0, D= 1.0, Fail=0.0
- AP Courses are weighted using a 5.0 scale.

## Rank in Class

- All students are included in the class ranking. Class ranking is computed including all grades earned in the 9-11 grade. 10-12 rank is computed including all grades earned in the sophomore and junior year.

## Advanced Education

- 67% of our senior class indicated they plan to attend a four-year institution and 26% plan to attend a two-year institution. 3% plan to attend a technical college. 3% plan to enter the military and 2% plan to enter the workforce full-time.
