Community: Founded in 2001, Chino Hills High School is a four-year comprehensive high school in the Chino Valley Unified School District. With a population of 77,058, the City of Chino Hills encompasses 45 miles in Southwestern San Bernardino County. Chino Hills is uniquely located at the junction of four Southern California Counties- Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino.

School: Chino Hills High School has a current enrollment of 2,751 students, 109 certified staff, and 50 classified staff. The administrative staff consists of a principal and three assistant principals. We have six academic counselors, two intervention counselors and two psychologists who all hold masters' degrees.

Calendar: Two 18-week semester grading periods; five days per week; six one hour and 2-minute periods

School District: Chino Valley Unified School District is comprised of 20 elementary schools, three fundamental schools; K-8, five junior high school (7-8), four comprehensive high schools, one alternative high school, Independent Study and Virtual Programs at all the comprehensive high schools, and a learning academy.
