Standard Exceeded (Level 4):- Will enroll in GE English and/or mathematics **college level courses** upon entering the CSU. Students are encouraged to continue preparation during the twelfth grade.

Standard Met (Level 3):- Must complete an **approved year-long English and/or mathematics course in the twelfth grade with a grade of “C-” or better**. Students will enroll in GE English and/or mathematics college-level courses upon entering the CSU.

Standard Nearly Met (Level 2) and Standard Not Met (Level 1):-Placed in **supported GE English and/or mathematics college-level courses** unless they meet the exemption criteria through completion of other multiple measures (ACT, SAT, High School coursework or high school grade point average, and college transfer coursework).
