The academic preparation policy ensures freshmen are placed in appropriate General Education (GE) **English** and **Mathematic** courses based on evaluating multiple measures:











<u>Standard Exceeded (Level 4)</u>- Will enroll in GE English and/or mathematics college level courses upon entering the CSU. Students are encouraged to continue preparation during the twelfth grade.

<u>Standard Met (Level 3)-</u> Must complete an approved year-long English and/or mathematics course in the twelfth grade with a grade of "C-" or better. Students will enroll in GE English and/or mathematics college-level courses upon entering the CSU.

<u>Standard Nearly Met (Level 2) and Standard Not Met (Level 1)</u>-Placed in supported GE English and/or mathematics college-level courses unless they meet the exemption criteria through completion of other multiple measures (ACT, SAT, High School coursework or high school grade point average, and college transfer coursework).</u>
