## Classwork/Google

- Notes are taken in notebooks and "Notes-books." They can be brought home for review, but MeST be brought to class each day
- Classwork may completed on Google Classroom
- If not completed to student's best ability, assignments will be returned with a comment
- Late assignments ALWAYS accepted (no loss in credit)
- Sign up as a guardian for summaries of work and grades


### to students and parents?


