

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Here is a simple guide to help you decide when to keep your student home from school and when they can return based on recommendations from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the California Department of Public Health.

### Fever

- Stay home if a fever is 100.4°F or higher.
- Return when fever has gone away without fever-reducing medication for a full night.

### Diarrhea

- Stay home if your student's stool is likely to leak or if they are unlikely to make it to the toilet in time.
   If the stool looks bloody or black, seek medical attention.
- Return when improving.

### **Vomiting**

- Stay home if vomiting has occurred two or more times in 24 hours.
- Return when vomiting has ended overnight, and your student is able to hold down liquids and food.

### **Tardies**

- 5-6 tardies = 2

### <u>Unexcused absences</u>

- Per every 2 unexcused absences performance mark will be lowered on Habits of Success
- Excused absence does not affect their grade





### Curriculum

This year, we are excited to share our approach to the 6th-grade curriculum, which emphasizes a dynamic and engaging learning environment for our students.

### **Subject Rotation**

Students will be rotating through four different subjects:

- Math (Big Ideas)
- Writing
- **Social Studies**
- Science (Discovery)

Students will be placed in **mixed learning groups**, allowing for collaboration and diverse perspectives.

### **Rotation Schedule**

- Students will rotate for **Math** daily, ensuring consistent practice and support.
- For Writing, Social Studies, and Science, students will rotate twice a week.

### Curriculum

We will also be rotating for **WIN Time**, which stands for "What I Need." During this dedicated time, we will focus on providing tailored extensions and interventions based on individual student needs.

### Fluid Groupings

All groupings are designed to be very fluid, allowing us to reassess and adjust frequently to ensure that each student receives the best possible support for their learning journey.

In addition to our academic subjects, we will be implementing the Second Step Curriculum, which focuses on:

- Social-Emotional Learning: Helping students develop skills such as empathy, emotion management, and
- Building Positive Relationships: Encouraging respectful interactions and effective communication among
- Conflict Resolution: Equipping students with strategies to handle disagreements and challenges
- Goal Setting: Students will learn how to set personal and academic goals, fostering a growth mindset and encouraging them to take ownership of their learning.





# Grading/Report Cards

### **Performance Level Marks**

- **4 Excelling** Students at the Excelling level of performance are consistently performing at grade level, can demonstrate independence, and can extend the grade level standards, when applicable, expected at this point of the school year.
- **3 Achieving** Students at the Achieving level of performance demonstrate an adequate understanding of and ability to apply skills needed to meet grade level standards expected at this point of the school year.
- **2 Progressing** Students at the Progressing level of performance are partially meeting the grade level standards expected at this point in the school year.
- **1 Beginning/Standard Not Met** Students at the Beginning/Standard Not Met are not yet meeting the grade level standards expected at this point of the school year. Performance level marks describe students' progress toward year-end standards.




# Homework Expectations

To support student accountability and learning, we have established the following homework expectations:

- Homework Ticket: Students will be issued a homework ticket if any assignment for that night is more than 50% incomplete.
- **Ticket Process**: Homework tickets will be sent home and are expected to be signed by both the **student and parent**. The ticket should be returned along with the completed missing or incomplete work.
- Meeting Requirement: If a student receives a homework ticket, they will be required to meet with me to discuss the reasons for their incomplete work.
- **Understanding Emergencies**: I understand that emergencies happen and life can get busy. In these cases, please make a note on their assignment and either sign it or send me an **email/Dojo message**. Students will not be issued a homework ticket for these rare situations, but they will be responsible for finding out what assignments were missed.
- Missed Work Policy: Students will have 1 day per day they were absent to complete their missed work. For example:
  - If a student was out for 1 day, they have 1 day to complete the work.
  - If a student was out for 3 days, they have 3 days to complete the work.




# Chromebook Expectations

As part of our commitment to fostering responsibility and preparedness among students, we have established the following Chromebook expectations:

- Daily Requirement: Students are expected to bring their Chromebooks to school every day, fully charged and ready for use.
- Homework Ticket: If a student's Chromebook is forgotten or brought to school with a low battery, they will receive a
  homework ticket. This emphasizes the importance of being responsible and prepared to learn.
- Loaner Chromebooks: We will have a limited number of loaner Chromebooks available in class for emergencies.

  Please note that there are not enough loaners for everyone, so it is essential for students to come prepared with their own devices.
- **Digital Citizenship**: Students are expected to practice being good **digital citizens** by using their Chromebooks in class solely for **educational purposes**. This includes engaging with class materials and activities, ensuring a focused and productive learning environment.






### **Minor Behaviors**

The Strike is a form of communication between the school and the parent/guardian. After having a conversation about the Strike with your child, please have your child return the signed Strike to school the next day.






