In the Classroom

The 7th & 8th grade team will work with students and their families to support students' success in meeting or exceeding the CA Common Core State Standards. Some of our key ways to connect our classroom practices with the school goals will be to:

- Incorporate the 4 Cs into all disciplines with an emphasis on critical thinking to facilitate 21st century skills.
- The ability to navigate and utilize various technological tools such as, multi-media, digital text, and video lessons into all core classes to facilitate 21st century technology skills.
- Allow "think-time" to process a question and "pair share" to formulate a final answer before class discussions. Teachers check for understanding throughout the lesson and provide timely feedback to students.
- Online components of Math and Language Arts curriculum can be used at school and from home to facilitate the continued practice of concepts. (Read 180 and Math 180 are used to support students in intervention classes).
- Real time access to grades, assignments, progress, and attendance through Aeries.net and Grade Alert.
- Monitor student progress using MTSS for academics and behavior.

At Home

Activities at home to support what my child is doing at school:

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

In ELA/ELD:

- Encourage daily reading at home and discuss readings with your student.
- Have conversations with your student and ask for reasoning and evidence.
- Attend ELA/ELD workshops, ELAC meetings.

In Math:

- Review homework with your student.
- Enforce the use of web-based supplemental programs at home (CAASPP Practice Test, Khan Academy, etc.).
- Encourage students to attend before/after school help sessions.
- Attend informational meetings and parent workshops.

In ELA/ELD, Math, Science and History:

- Check student's agenda, notebooks, backpacks, Aeries.Net & Grade Alert on a daily/weekly basis as needed.
- Hold your student accountable for completing homework on a nightly basis.
- Stav in contact with vour student's teachers.

Student Learning Activities

Activities students will do to support their learning:

- Use Thinking Maps to organize thoughts around a topic or question to prepare for oral or written communication.
- Demonstrate receptiveness to feedback when engaging in collaboration with peers and teachers.
