

Assignments

- A weekly plan for students will be posted at the beginning of each week on Google Classroom.
- Work will be assigned and submitted through Google Classroom, ConnectED Wonders (ELA), Twig (Science) and Savvas (Math), and in-person.
- Daily assignments will be given. Should students not complete work during class, they will be expected to finish the work in addition to given homework.
- All work must be completed and submitted by the posted due date on the assignment.

*All work must be completed by the student with only clarifying questions allowed. Academic dishonesty (cheating, copying, etc.) will result in consequences consistent with district guidelines. (Please see the Parent and Student Handbook for more information. This can be accessed on the school website under the parents tab.)

Assessments

- Assessments will be included in the weekly plan students have access to at the beginning of each week.
- Assessments must be completed and submitted by the posted due dates for students to receive a score for their work
- Assessments will take place on Savvas Math, ConnectED Wonders ELA, Twig Science, and Google Classroom, and in-person.

*All assessments must be completed by the student with only clarifying questions allowed. Feedback/Grades

- Work completed and submitted on time will be assessed by the teacher and the teacher will leave comments and scoring information.
- Parents can sign up to be a guardian in Google Classroom. As a guardian, parents can receive a weekly summary of their student's assignments.
- Students and parents can view grades and missing assignments in Google Classroom. Tests and some assignments completed in Wonders, Twig, and Savvas will be automatically scored and results can be viewed on these platforms.
- Parents will be encouraged to sign on to their Aeries Parent Portal Account to view announcements.
- Teachers may also be emailing individually to communicate with parents regarding student progress.
