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CVUSD Schools Recognized for Applying Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports

Thirty-three CVUSD schools and the Chino Valley Learning Academy earn a Platinum, Gold, or Silver ranking through the California PBIS Coalition.

Chino, CA – Earlier this month, thirty-three Chino Valley Unified School District (CVUSD) schools and the Chino Valley Learning Academy (CVLA) were listed as either a Platinum, Gold, or Silver Medal recipient on the California PBIS Coalition's (CPS) 2021/2022 Award Winning Schools List. Recognition was granted to each qualifying school that successfully met program criteria for implementing features of positive behavioral interventions and supports (PBIS) on its campus during the 2021-2022 school year.

For the first time ever, one CVUSD school earned the Platinum medal, which is the highest level of achievement that can be obtained through the PBIS system. Woodcrest Junior High School has been recognized as a Platinum recipient for showing evidence of Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3 advanced interventions that assist students through more intensive supports.

Twenty-three CVUSD schools earned Gold recognition for their school prevention strategies that include teaching and modeling school-wide expectations, creating a system that recognizes appropriate behavior, and establishing a restorative approach that corrects behavior by focusing on assigning consequences that support and teach students.

An additional nine CVUSD schools, and the Chino Valley Learning Academy (CVLA), earned silver recognition by providing evidence of positive student outcomes through school-wide prevention strategies that include teaching and acknowledging school-wide expectations, maintaining a system that acknowledges appropriate behaviors, and promoting classroom strategies that focus on preventing misbehavior while encouraging safe, inclusive environments.

PBIS is a systems-based, multi-tiered framework that aims to help improve academics, reduce problem behaviors, increase attendance, reduce bullying, and improve social and emotional competency of students.

The program emphasizes the utilization of a process, or approach, rather than a curriculum, intervention, or practice. CPC initiated its first statewide effort in 2015 to implement a recognition system that acknowledges schools for implementing PBIS with fidelity to the national framework.

The Chino Valley Unified School District honorees, along with other statewide school awardees, will be recognized at the 7th Annual Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports Showcase on November 8th at the Victoria Gardens Cultural Center.
