Measure G is a \$750 million school construction and modernization bond approved by Chino Valley voters in November 2016. The passage of Measure G provides a major investment in CVUSD schools, not just for the students currently attending but for generations to come.

The COC meets four times per year to review expenditure and construction reports to ensure that Measure G bond proceeds were expended only for the purposes set forth in Measure G, to inform the public concerning the District's expenditure of Measure G bond proceeds, and present to the Board of Education in public session, an annual written report outlining its activities and conclusions regarding the expenditure of Measure G bond proceeds.
