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Thirty-Three CVUSD Schools Recognized for Applying Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports

Thirty CVUSD schools earn the highest recognition offered in CA PBIS System.

Chino, CA – Earlier this month, thirty-three Chino Valley Unified School District (CVUSD) schools, including the Chino Valley Learning Academy (CVLA), were listed as either a Platinum or Gold Medal recipient on the California PBIS Coalition's (CPC) 2023/2024 Award Winning Schools List. Recognition was granted to each qualifying school that successfully met program criteria for implementing features of positive behavioral interventions and supports (PBIS) on its campus during the 2023/2024 school year.

After earning its first Platinum medal during the 2021/2022 school year, CVUSD schools that have earned this distinguished designation have grown to include 30 sites. To earn Platinum recognition, which is the highest level of achievement that can be obtained through the PBIS system, recipients must show evidence of Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3 advanced interventions that assist students through more intensive supports. According to this year's CA PBIS list, the Chino Valley Unified School District boasts the second highest number of school sites to earn Platinum recognition in California.

Three CVUSD schools earned Gold recognition for their school prevention strategies that include teaching and modeling school-wide expectations, creating a system that recognizes appropriate behavior, and establishing a restorative approach that corrects behavior by focusing on assigning consequences that support and teach students.

"Creating a positive school environment and nurturing a campus where students want to be present is vital to establishing a strong foundation for both academic and personal success. It takes an immense amount of dedication to foster an effective behavioral system that makes a significant impact on individual and collective actions. It's no surprise that our committed CVUSD staff was up to the task of accomplishing this amazing feat," Superintendent Norm Enfield shared.

PBIS is a systems-based, multi-tiered framework that aims to help improve academics, reduce problem behaviors, increase attendance, reduce bullying, and improve social and emotional competency of students. The program emphasizes the utilization of a process, or approach, rather than a curriculum, intervention, or practice. CPC initiated its first statewide effort in 2015 to implement a recognition system that acknowledges schools for implementing PBIS with fidelity to the national framework.

The Chino Valley Unified School District honorees, along with other statewide school awardees, will be recognized at the 9th Annual Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) Conference on October 9-11 in Sacramento.
