Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals - Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)

All students are provided a high-quality teaching and learning environment.

SCHOOL GOALS

- 1. On the 2022 CAASPP **ELA** the percent of students scoring "Standards
- Met" and "Standards Exceeded" (combined) will increase from 39% to 50% in each grade level (11%increase)
- 2. On the 2022 CAASPP **Math** the percent of students scoring "Standards
- Met" and "Standards Exceeded" (combined) will increase from 25% to 35% in each grade level (10%increase).

Our school provides high quality curriculum and instruction in supportive and effective classroom environments to enable students to meet state academic standards. We support our students and work hard to provide a welcoming, safe school environment.

Teachers, Parents, Students SHARED RESPONSIBILITY for Learning

In the Classroom: Magnolia JHS teachers have the whole student in mind as they implement Common Core State Standards and researchbased practices in classroom instruction.

Magnolia Junior High School's 7th & 8th grade team will work with students and their families to support students' success in meeting or exceeding the CA Common Core State Standards. Some of our key ways to connect our classroom practices with the school goals will be to:

- Incorporate the 4 Cs into all disciplines with an emphasis on critical thinking to facilitate 21st century skills.
- The ability to navigate and utilize various technological tools such as virtual classroom environments, multimedia, digital text, and video lessons into all core classes to facilitate 21st century technology skills.
- Provide "think-time" to process a question and "pair share" to formulate a final answer before class discussions. Teachers check for understanding throughout the lesson and provide timely feedback to students.
- Online components of Math and Language Arts curriculum can be used at school and from home to facilitate the continued practice of concepts. (Read 180 and Math 180 are used to support students in intervention classes).
- Real time access to grades, assignments, progress, and attendance through Aeries and virtual classroom platforms.

At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

- Utilize the AERIES Parent Portal to access your child's grades, attendance, and behavior
- Contact their teachers and counselor (via email or virtual office hours) to maintain an open line of communication via email/phone and review other resources available.
- Be present! Establish time at home to discuss school, daily experiences, and positive interactions either during distance or in-person learning.
- Structure a routine for your child that fosters attention to completing homework, maintaining a healthy lifestyle, and attending school daily.
- READ! READ! READ! & TALK! TALK! TALK! Model this for your child and create an environment where books, magazines, etc. are accessible. Make time for reading, discussion and sharing of what is read. This builds academic language! Check your child's school work, school supplies, and back pack routinely to establish an expectation of success.
- If recommended, sign-up your child to participate in school intervention opportunities.
