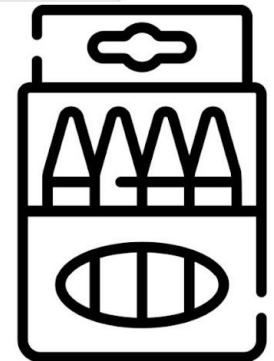
6th Grade Optional Supply List

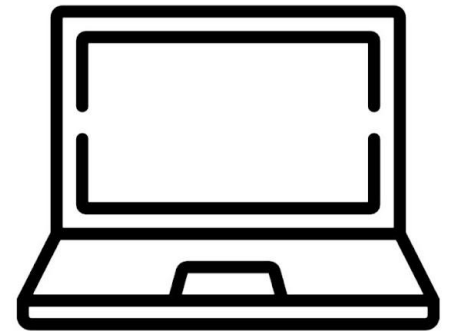

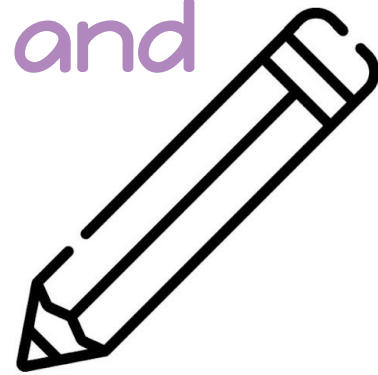
