Our Goals for Student Achievement

All students are provided a high-quality teaching and learning environment.

Staff, parents, families, and students are connected and engaged at their school to ensure student success.

All students are prepared for college and career beyond graduation.

School Goals

GOAL 1

Ayala feeder group principals will utilize data collection tools to monitor PLC process to meet "Collaborative Team Action Plan" Number 5 and 8. The principals will collaborate to complete monthly classroom "walk-throughs" (CLR's) to view learning intentions, success criteria, student engagement, and a positive learning environment.

GOAL 2

LCAP Goal 2: Students, parents, families, and staff are connected and engaged to their school to ensure student success. School Level SMART Goal: The Tier I team will use monthly data-based decision making (Feature 1.13) by incorporating discipline, attendance and academic outcomes for decision making. The PBIS Tier II Team will assess CICO features (Feature 2.5) and make needed updates: entrance criteria, staff training according to role, family information letter, CICO point card, data system readiness, Fade-Out criteria, and Success Criteria SMART Goal Checkpoint 1: Internal TF #1= 93% SMART Goal Checkpoint 2: Internal TFI #2 = TBA (NOTE: This goal will more than likely change after the External TFI (PBIS Tier I and II Teams). Additionally, Litel will continue offer three Parent Engagement workshops/PBIS workshops per year based on LCAP community feedback, and the intent will to have 15 parent participants in each workshop.

GOAL 3

All Students will score at 68% as either Meeting or Exceeding Standards within the Mathematics portion of the 2023-2024 CAASPP assessment and 70% of all students will score at either Meeting or Exceeding Standard within the 2023-2024 CAASPP. Additionally, English Learners will increase their performance score (in ELA) as measured by the CAASPP by .2.5% and (in Math), they English Learners will increase their score by 3.0%.

Teachers, Parents, Students Shared Responsibility for Learning

In the Classroom

As a Litel teacher, I will engage all students with a vibrant learning climate and high-quality instruction. Listed below are some of the student learning strategies your child will use this year.

GOAL 1

- Students write daily as part of instruction in all subject areas and share to build oral language development
- ✓ Students use reasoning to explain problem solving
- ✓ Students and teachers use Thinking Maps throughout instruction
- Encourage critical thinking, creativity, communication, collaboration, & communication.
 (4 C's)

GOAL 2

- Teachers will communicate with parents when they need parent volunteers
- ✓ Parents are encouraged to engage with nightly homework, nightly reading, and discussions around the Second Step curriculum

GOAL 3

- ✓ Designated DELD is provided 5 days a week for 30 minutes a day and Integrated ELD is provided throughout the school day
- Instruct in a variety of learning styles such as visual, auditory, kinesthetic, etc.
- ✓ Instruct using various ELD strategies such as pair sharing, pictures, posters, read-alouds, etc.
- Targeted interventions at the Tier I level, and as needed, outside of the classroom for Tier II to III reading intervention

At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

- Establish a daily routine for when your child comes home and needs to complete homework.
- Encourage your child to write often outside of homework (i.e., thank you notes, lists, letters).
- Ask your child to explain what they are learning in math and practice different strategies.
- Have your child reference and use Thinking Maps after reading and before writing.
- ✓ Constantly reinforce school behavioral expectations at home; R.O.A.R.: Responsible, Optimistic, Accountable, Respectful
- Speak with your child about the Second Step lessons taught in class.
- ✓ Encourage exploration and creativity at home.
- ✓ Read with your child nightly.
- ✓ Practice speaking in complete sentences.
- Make sure that your child maintains excellent attendance.
- ✓ Establish a nightly routine to help prepare for the following school day.
