Language/Profanity	Student engages in language not directed at staff member Language between students deemed inappropriate Examples: Primary-stupid, idiot, jerk, loser, dummy, shut up Upper-a**hole, f***, sh**, up yours	Language/Profanity	Swearing directly at staff member/student/adult on site Derogatory comments about or directed at specific groups of people Examples: -F** you, you're an a**hole, b**ch
Aggressive Behavior	Rough Housing -Being overly aggressive with others Examples: -Playful contact, pushing in line, poking, kicking Rowdy Behavior -Unable to sit still/disturbing others Examples: -Getting out of seat/yelling/running in class/throwing objects	Aggressive Behavior	Student engages in actions involving serious physical contact where injury occurs. Student intentionally spits or dumps substance on another individual Student spits at/towards another individual as a sign of defiance/disrespect Examples: Hitting (with an object)/punching/scratching/biting Punching the desks due to temper
Intentional Physical/Verbal Harm	Student engages in non-serious, but inappropriate physical contact Student engages in disrespectful, non-threatening language towards others Examples: Shoving others to get to a destination or an item Pointing out someone's mistakes, laughing at someone inappropriately	Intentional Physical/Verbal Harm	Interaction resulting in serious physical or mental injury Examples: Punching/kicking/attacking/etc.
Harassment (sexual/physical)	Inappropriate jokes, comments, gestures, or noises that could be offensive to others that are not directed at a specific person Embracing, grabbing, or tapping someone without their permission	Harassment (sexual/physical)	 Student directly delivers disrespectful message in any format related to gender, ethnicity, sex, race, religion, disability, physical features to another student Making inappropriate sexual remarks or physical advances towards another individual
Insubordination / Defiance / Dishonesty	Disruptive/Defiant Behavior *Student engages in brief or low-intensity failure to follow directions or talks back *Low-intensity, socially rude or dismissive messages to adults or students *Disruptive during class time (talking/noises, moving around classroom, passing notes) *Refusal to complete tasks *Not following instructions *Working inappropriately during group/independent activities Examples: *Off task/eye rolling/gum chewing/talking back/outbursts Dishonest *Lying about a minor incident *Unfair play, cheating in a game, not following rules of an activity *Covering for a friend committing a major act of dishonesty	Insubordination / Defiance / Dishonesty	Insubordination/Defiance -Teacher has used interventions to correct behavior and has filled out incident log, parents have been contacted by phone at least twice. -Uncontrollable behavior requiring office assistance -getting out of seat/yelling/running in class/throwing objects Dishonesty -Cheating on assignments/test -Stealing
Threatening Others	Wishing ill will upon someone else, hoping something bad will happen to someone Example: I hope you fall off the slide and get hurt.", "I hope your computer breaks"	Threatening Others	•Making remarks about hurting student/teacher/school Example: •"I'm going to kill you", "I'm going to hurt/fight you"
Weapons	Making weapon gestures with your hands Using items/objects as a pretend weapon	Weapons	 Making a weapon gesture with your hands directed towards someone Making a weapon gesture with an item/object as a pretend weapon directed towards someone Any possession of a knife or gun (real or fake) other objects used to cause a bodily injury
Property Damage / Misuse of Property	*Student engages in low-intensity misuse of property *Student draws on/colors on school/someone's property using impermanent means *Use of electronic devices at inappropriate times *Examples: *Swinging headphones by cord, tossing pens in the air, coloring on a desk/wall with washable markers *Using cell phone / smart watch during school hours *Listening to music on electronic device without teacher permission *Changing computer settings/mishandling laptops	Property Damage	Student destroys/defaces school property or the property of others Examples: Breaking something on purpose/tagging/carving into desks or doors Breaking/destroying another student's belongings
Fighting	Pretend fighting that could result in accidental harm or turning into a real fight	Fighting	•Student engages in or has made plans to engage in physical violence with others
Teasing (Leading to Bullying)	Teasing, making fun of, or spreading rumors about another person Any unwanted physical or verbal contact that has not developed into a pattern yet	Bullying	Pattern of severe or pervasive unwanted physical or verbal contact Examples: Name calling/intimidating/chronic unwanted physical contact

Examples:
-Removal from activity, seat change, individual conference, communication with parent, etc.
