Students will actively engage in an exploration of culture in both contemporary and historical contexts.

This course takes a holistic approach to language proficiency and recognizes the complex interrelatedness of comprehension and comprehensibility, vocabulary usage, language control, communication strategies, and cultural awareness. This course strives to promote both fluency and accuracy in language use. In short, students should be able to turn the skills and knowledge acquired in the classroom into a functional experience that can be used to excel by communicating effectively in the Spanish-speaking world. This class is taught in Spanish to facilitate the study of language and culture.






COURSE Overview Focus areas.

- 1. Listening: follow a conversation between educated, native Spanish speakers (includes idiomatic and colloquial expressions). Obtain information from oral reports or other types of narrative. Recognize the purpose and motivation of the speaker.
- 2. Reading: Increase overall comprehension of expository and narrative selections. Engage in critically reading magazines, newspapers, and articles on various topics. Identify rhetorical, semantics, and syntactic information. Infer from text and expressions.
- 3. Writing: Write a variety of styles and ideas. Engage in creative writing in various modes, including narrative, expository, argumentative, and imaginative. Develop a personal voice and writing style in Spanish.
- 4. Speaking: Develop expository solid, informational, and narrative speaking abilities. Engage in authentic conversations using person interests, opinions, narratives and comparisons.

ALL AREAS OF FOCUS should reflect personal learning and skills; we will work together to develop and increase Spanish skills. AP Language is challenging but focuses on your growth and development as a Spanish Speaker.

Although there may not be **formal homework** assigned **on some days**, it is expected of *Students* to practice and study at home for at least 20-30 *minutes a day*.


It is expected that you engage and participate during class and self-learning activities. This means being attentive, respectful, and refraining from any distractions.
