
 Please empty the "Keep at Home" side daily. We will have one page of homework each day, typically math. I also ask that students practice their spelling words and read nightly.













Accelerated Reader



If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.
