Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals - Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)

All students are provided a high-quality teaching and learning environment.

Staff, parents/guardians, families, and students are connected and engaged at their school to ensure student success

All students are prepared for college and career beyond graduation.

School Goals

GOAL 1 On the 2022-2023 CAASPP, the percent of students scoring Standards Met and Standards Exceeded (combined) in ELA will increase to 58%. On the 2022-2023 CAASPP, the percent of students scoring Standards Met and Standards Exceeded (combined) in Math will increase to 51%

GOAL 2 At least 70% of our parents/guardians will attend parent conferences and school events as measured by sign ins and/or attendance numbers. The school staff will continue to implement a schoolwide Tier 2 and Tier 3 MTSS-B intervention supports and services.

GOAL 3 On the 2022-2023 CAASPP, the percent of students scoring Standards Met and Standards Exceeded (combined) in ELA will increase from 54% to 55%. On the 2022-2023 CAASPP, the percent of students scoring Standards Met and Standards Exceeded (combined) in Math will increase from 39% to 51%.

Teachers, Families/Guardians, Students Shared Responsibility for Learning

In the Classroom

As a second-grade teacher, I will engage all students with a vibrant learning climate and high-quality instruction. Listed below are some of the student learning strategies your child will use this year.

GOAL 1 Students will use thinking maps to create a thorough understanding of the topic and to organize the information to create a more detailed and descriptive writing with increased clarity of the topic.

GOAL 2 Students will work in small, collaborative groups to share information to other students in their class that can be used in presentations, reports, or other learning activities.

<u>GOAL</u> 3 Students will use leveled DOK questioning to promote and foster Critical Thinking Skills and use digital tools to increase academic (Tier 2 words) and content vocabulary (Tier 3 words).

Non-Academic Goal

A social-emotional learning program will be provided called Second Step. The focus is for students to clearly understand and abide by the school wide expectations of being respectful, responsible, and safe, leading to exemplary, productive citizens.

English Learner Goal

EL students will be provided:

30 minutes of daily English Language Development lessons using visuals, front loading vocabulary, and thinking maps to support math, science, language arts, and social studies learning.

At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

Academic:

Ensure your student is at school on time each day. Encourage your student to read daily. Students are required to read at home Monday through Thursday for 20 minutes or more. Students should be reading a book at their independent level.

Help your student to use the internet properly and effectively.

Monitor your student's homework to ensure it is complete and turned in daily.

Attend academic based school events such as Back to School Night, Open House, conferences, and School Based Community Events.

Non-Academic:

Volunteer and participate in non-academic events such as Meet Your Teacher Day, Movie Night, Fall Fundraiser, Trunk or Treat Night, Book Fair, and Paint Night.

Join the principals for pastries and pan dulce. Encourage your student to act responsibly, respectfully, and to be safe always.

English Learner:

Attend ELAC Meetings.

Share various resources, materials, and learning tools shown and taught at the ELAC meetings with your student at home to ensure their success.

At home, I will reinforce classroom learning by utilizing the various academic, non-academic, and EL Learning ideas suggested above.
