# **Integrated 2 Expectations 2022-2023**

Welcome back to school and to Integrated Math 2. We will learn concepts from Algebra and Geometry in this class.

### **Grading Policy**

1. <u>Grades</u> are based on the number of points earned in the class. Grades are assigned according to the percentage of points earned out of the total points possible. Grades will be divided into two portions as detailed below.

# 1. Assessment-based grade (70% of the total grade):

- Tests (50%): Tests will be given at the end of each chapter. The final test will be worth a minimum of two tests.
- Quizzes (20%): Quizzes will be given frequently. The two lowest quiz scores will be removed from the final grade calculations at the end of each semester.

# 2. Effort-based grade (30% of the total grade):

- Notes/Classwork (10%): Unless otherwise noted, each assignment is worth 5 pts.
- Homework Assignments (10%): Unless otherwise noted, each assignment is worth 5 pts.
- Other (10%): Other non-homework and/or non-classwork items including these course guidelines and participation, are included here. The Skill Practice quizzes will be included here. A project may or may not be assigned each semester.
- 2. <u>Tests</u> will be given in the middle and/or at the end of each Chapter. It is your responsibility to make up any tests that you miss due to an excused absence. Being absent on the day of the review will not delay taking the test. You will be required to take the test on the day as scheduled since I post test days well in advance. If you are absent on the day of the test then you will be required to take the exam on the day that you return. Your grade will be entered in as a zero if you have a truant or an unverified/unexcused absence on the day of the test. <u>I do not give extra credit or extra work to raise grades</u>. The only extra credit opportunities are given in the form of bonus questions at the end of tests.
- 3. <u>Quizzes</u> will be given often and I will include the 5 highest quiz grades every grading period. It is your responsibility to make up any quizzes missed due to an excused absence upon your return to school. Any missed quizzes that are not made up before they are passed back will be averaged into your grade as a zero. Quizzes missed due to a truant or unexcused absence will be entered into your grade as a zero and will not be eligible to be dropped.

### 4. MAKE UPS and CORRECTIONS:

Upon an absence, it is the student's responsibility to make up any missed assignments, quizzes or tests. Assignments are due by the **due date**. **Arrangements** need to be made with the teacher to extend the deadline in the event of absence(s). **Late** assignments may not be accepted. Failure to make up tests or quizzes within the number of days absent will result in a reduction of 10% per day late. Teacher reserves the right to change the format of make up tests and quizzes.

**Tests and quizzes** below 90% can be corrected for up to half the original points (maximum score: 90%). The student <u>must make an **appointment** to make the corrections and must re-do the **review**. Quiz corrections must be made before the chapter test is taken.</u>

- 5. <u>Homework/Classwork</u> is an important part of your grade and will be given daily. I will only accept late work due to an excused absence. You will have one day for every day of excused absence to make up the missed work. I expect all students to give maximum effort in all work. Please attempt every problem and always show your work to earn full credit on every assignment. If you get stuck, then you will be required to write a question that would help you further your work and understanding. "I don't know." or "I don't get it." are not questions and will not be accepted.
- 6. <u>Notes</u> are an important tool for learning the required material and will be given on a daily basis. Please use a notebook that is for this class ONLY. Notes will be checked periodically. These are for you to refer back to when doing homework or studying for quizzes and tests.

## Math Notebook Procedures:

- 1. Titles at the top of each page (including the date)
- 2. Clearly labeled and completely/accurately worked examples
- 3. Clearly labeled Theorems, Postulates and Definitions
- 4. Daily homework assignments clearly written in the same place for each day's notes. (At the top near the title, or at the end and highlighted, underlined, or outlined)

<u>WARNING</u>: If you do your homework in your notebook, you must be prepared to turn the page in if asked. <u>Do NOT do your homework on the back of notes if you are trying to keep all of your notes together!!!!</u>

- 7. <u>Projects</u> will be given at least once each semester. Since project due dates will be given well in advance, late projects will be penalized. Unexcused/unverified absences and/or technological difficulties will not be accepted as excuses for late projects.
- 8. <u>District/Department Final Exams</u> will be given at the end of each semester. Arrangements must be made in advance if you are going to be absent on the day of the final exam. Truant, unexcused or unverified absences will result in a zero being averaged into your grade for the final exam. Second semester's final is cumulative and includes questions from first semester.
- 9. All students *EARN* their grades in my class. <u>I do not round or curve progress report or semester grades</u>. The scale is as follows:

90.0-100 A 80.0-89.9 B 70.0-79.9 C 60.0-69.9 D 59.9 and less F

## **After Hours Homework Help**

Mr. Jara will be available most days: Monday through Thursdays after school from 2:30 to 3:00 p.m. excluding days when I have meetings (which is quite often). Please check with me ahead of time to make sure that I will be available. Please come in with focused questions and problems that you have already attempted and please don't wait until the day before a test.

### **Classroom Rules**

- 1. Follow all school rules. This includes the district dress code, gum policy, academic honesty and phone policy.
  - 2. **Be respectful with your phone.** Please put your phones and headphones away as soon as you enter class.

- <u>1.5" loose-leaf notebook (PREFERRED)</u> with lined paper or single subject spiral binder or composition notebook
- Graph paper (1/4 inch).
- Compass, protractor, and ruler with both standard (inch) and metric (centimeter) measures.
- Scientific calculator <u>TI-30X IIS</u>: <u>Purchase of ONLY this model is HIGHLY RECOMMENDED</u>
- 6. **Be honest.** Cheating of any type will result in a zero on the assignment, quiz or test for both parties involved. Please see the student handbook for a definition of academic dishonesty.
- 7. No eating, drinking (except water) or gum chewing is allowed in my class.

## **Consequences for Infractions of Rules**

Breaking classroom rules will result in one or more of the following: a warning, a detention, a phone call home, and/or a referral to the counselor or assistant principal. The consequence will be determined according to the severity of the infraction and your prior history of behavior in my classroom.

# **Electronics Policy**

Electronics (anything with a power button – except for a scientific calculator) should be silenced and put away when you enter our class. Please put your headphones away as well (not in or hanging around your ears). You must have permission to have your phones out and we will use them on occasion in class. THEY SHOULD NEVER BE USED AS A CALCULATOR! Phones that are out when they are not allowed will be confiscated as per school policy written in the student handbook.
