 - Recognizing Bullying & Harassment





GRADING POLICY

- Summative Assignments will receive a Standard Based Grade of a 1, 2, 3, or 4.
- All graded assignments will be sent home in students' Friday Folders.
- Assignments that receive a 1 or 2 must be signed and returned.
- Students will create goals, track progress, and fill out a Test Self-Reflection Sheet on all graded assignments
- Students will also be given performance marks for their "Habits of Success."

4 - Excelling: Students at the Excelling level of performance are consistently performing at grade level, can demonstrate independence, and can extend the grade level standards, when applicable, expected a this point of the school year.

2 - Progressing: Students at the Progressing level of performance are partially meeting the grade level standards expected at this point of the school year.

ASSESSMENTS

- Students will take weekly vocabulary quizzes on Thursdays.
- Math, ELA, Social Studies, & Science assessments come at the end of each unit/chapter.

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EXAM

- Students will be provided with a study guide for Social sciences, and a practice test for Math.
- Students are encouraged to take and study their notes on a regular basis.
- Upcoming assessments will be announced on Parent Square.
 - Any missed assessments will need to be made up or given the automatic score of a 1.

HOMEWORK POLICY

- All homework will be posted on our digital homework agenda.
- The homework agenda can be found on Google Classroom or my Class Website.
- Students will be given a digital HW agenda/planner to use.
 - Students are responsible for making sure they have the necessary materials to complete assignments.
 - Students will receive a grade on their report cards under, "Responsibility for Academic Success" based on the completion of homework.

HOMEWORK POLICY

- Students will be assigned a math and writing assignment daily.
- Students will be required to read for 30 minutes daily and log their progress.
- All incomplete classwork will become homework.

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- Students will fill out a choice slip if homework is incomplete.
 - Students may be assigned After-School detention if homework is not being completed on a consistent basis.



 - Showing a growth mindset

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
Hinojo dollars can be used at the class shop on the 2nd and last Thursday of the month.

Rewards

Consequences

- Students will be held accountable for their behavior based on a weekly tally system.
 - Students will receive a tally for failing to be responsible, respectful or safe.
 - A weekly behavior report will go home in students' Friday Folders.



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Interventions

- 3 tallies will result in a choice slip
- 5 or more tallies will result in an Incident Log + Mandatory Behavior Reflection
 - After 3 incident logs, a minor referral will be issued.
