ELA Intervention Curriculum

The following is information about the current intervention program.

Grades K-3:

UFLI (University of Florida Learning Institute)- This is a phonics program that introduces students to the foundational reading skills necessary for proficient reading. The UFLI model is highly effective in improving struggling readers' "phonological" awareness of the sounds that make up spoken language, understanding the alphabet system for linking sounds to letters, and decoding skills for converting print to speech.

Sight Words- Appropriate level sight word practice broken down into four booklets.

Lexia Core5- This is a fun, computer-based program that has helped millions of students improve their literacy skills. The activities in Core5 support and build on your child's classroom curriculum and focus on developing reading skills in six areas: phonological awareness, phonics, structural analysis, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. This program is also accessible at home.

Decodable Reader- This is used when students need more practice in fluency with a letter sound.

Readworks- Positive Learning Outcomes: Regular use of ReadWorks benefits reading performance in fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary.

Grades 3-6: ELA Intervention Curriculum

The following is information about the current intervention program.

Readworks- Positive Learning Outcomes: Regular use of ReadWorks benefits reading performance in fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary.

Rewards Writing- This intervention program focuses on sentence refinement. 1) Students select more precise and interesting words. 2) Students improve the quality and variety of their sentences. 3) Students edit sentences within their compositions.

Lexia Core5- This is a fun, computer-based program that has helped millions of students improve their literacy skills. The activities in Core5 support and build on your child's classroom curriculum and focus on developing reading skills in six areas: phonological awareness, phonics, structural analysis, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. This program is also accessible at home.

CommonLit- CommonLit is an online-based literacy resource that offers standards-based training and assessments for students. Built to common-core standards, there is a broad selection of leveled texts of varying types.

Decodable Reader- This is used when students need more practice in fluency.

Rewards Reading- This intervention program is highly effective and has different levels to meet the needs of multiple grade levels. One of the major strengths of this program is teaching students how to break down multisyllabic words into recognizable word parts in order to decode accurately, but also to understand the meaning of the word.

Read Naturally- This intervention is used to provide students with practice in reading fluency, rate, accuracy, and comprehension. I have modified this program to be used as a tool for instruction, rather than to be used independently.

Note: Grades 4-6 are only seen for ELA and not math.
