# Expectations

- ▶ Get a good night's rest and eat a healthy breakfast.
- ▶ **Students come to school by 7:50 and are with the teacher at 8:00 PREPARED TO LEARN.**
- ▶ Make illness the only excuse for absences.
- ▶ Absent work will be given on the day the student returns.
- ▶ Complete classwork and homework assignments on time.
- ▶ **Read 15 minutes every day in addition to regularly assigned homework.**
- ▶ **Memorize math facts to automaticity (study nightly).**

# Behavior Expectations

- ▶ Please remind your student to follow school and classroom rules.
- ▶ PBIS Behavior Clip Chart:
  - ▶ **Role Model**: Outstanding- Demonstrates exemplary behavior all day.
  - ▶ **Kind and Thoughtful**: Great Day- Going above and beyond what is expected.
  - ▶ **Good Choices**: Good Day- Going a little beyond what is expected.
  - ▶ **Working Hard**: Ready to Learn- Doing what they are supposed to do.
  - ▶ **Make Better Choices**: Think About It- A reminder to redirect behavior.
  - ▶ **I can Improve**: Teacher's Choice- Discussion with teacher and a missed recess.

# Incident Logs

- ▶ Incident Logs are used for **OUTSIDE** minor playground offenses.
  - ▶ Examples: running before, during, or after school, pushing, playing after bell, using bathroom after the bell ...
  - ▶ Parent signature **REQUIRED**
- ▶ Grades 1-6
  - ▶ Incident Logs will warrant the following consequences (per trimester):
    - ▶ 1<sup>st</sup>: Warning
    - ▶ 2<sup>nd</sup>: Loss of a recess and citizenship grade on the report card lowered one level
    - ▶ 3<sup>rd</sup>: Office referral for 1 lunch detention
    - ▶ 4<sup>th</sup>: Parent/Student/Teacher Conference with an Administrator





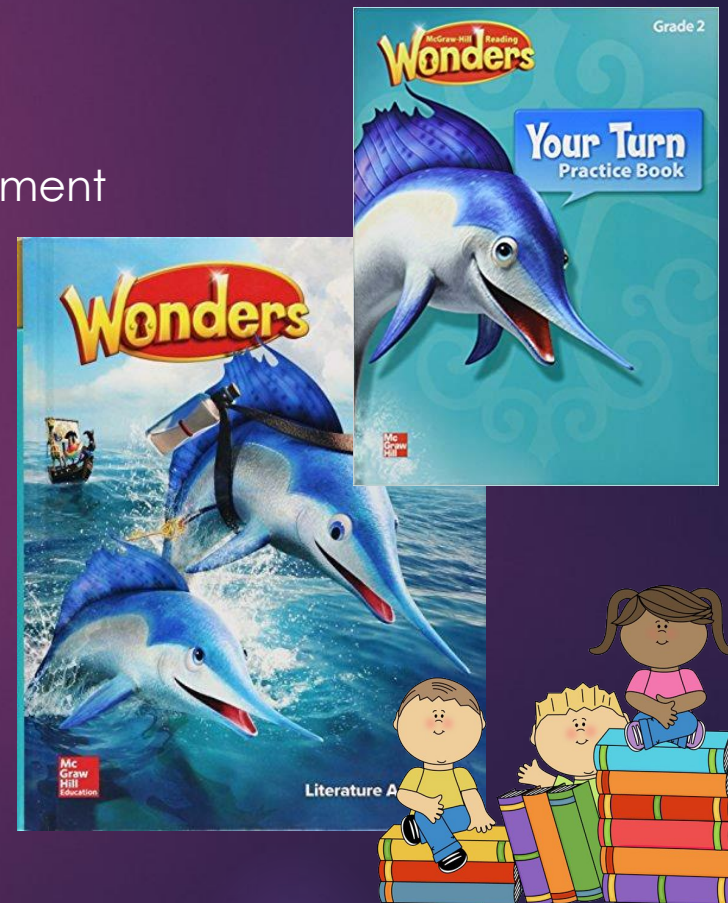
# Curriculum & Grading

- ▶ All grades are a combination of class work, tests, quizzes, class participation, homework, and/or teacher observation.
- ▶ The school district adopted a Standards Based Grading Report Card, resulting in students receiving the grades of 1, 2, 3, and 4.
- ▶ The second-grade curriculum is based on Common Core State Standards for Language Arts, Writing and Math, and state standards for Science and Social Studies. This year we have adopted the new Language Arts series called Wonders.

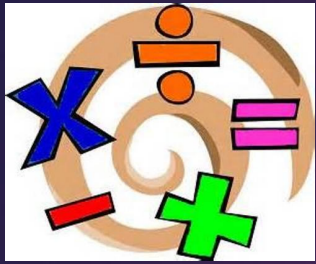


# Reading and English Language Arts

  - ▶ Opinion



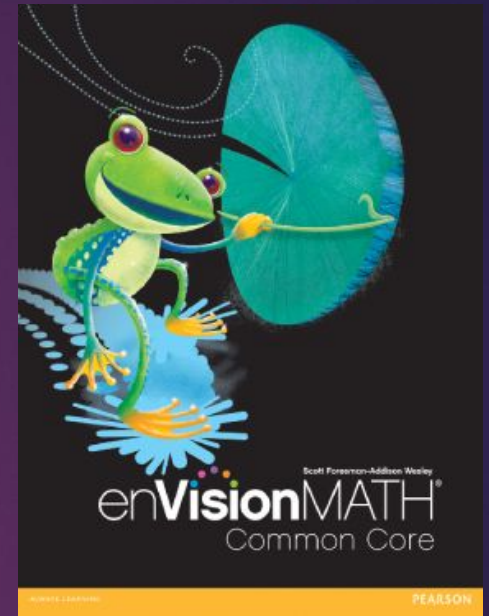




# Mathematics

  - ▶ Online access for students and parents can be found on your child's ClassLink account.

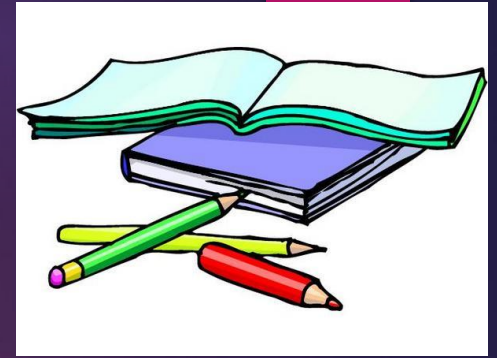




# Grading Scale

Grade/Number	Meaning
<b>4- Excelling</b>	Student is at the Excelling level of performance. They have an in-depth understanding of grade level performance standards expected at this point in the school year.
<b>3- Achieving</b>	Student is at the Achieving level of performance. They are consistently meeting the grade level performance standards expected at this point in the year.
<b>2- Progressing</b>	Student is at the Progressing level of performance. They are partially meeting the grade level performance standards expected at this point in the year.
<b>1- Beginning</b>	Student is at the Beginning/Standard Not Met level and is not yet meeting grade level performance standards expected at this point in the year.

# Classwork



- ▶ It is important that each student completes his/her classwork. If classwork is not finished in the time allotted, the student *may* have to complete it during recess or at home. To ensure that students always do their best, they may be asked to do an assignment over.

# Homework



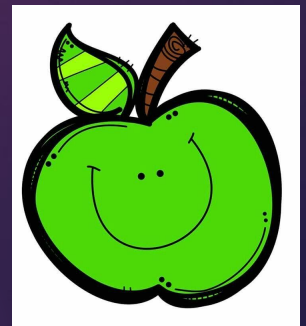
- ▶ Math homework will be assigned **Monday through Thursday** and is due at the START of class each day.
- ▶ District guidelines are 20-30 focused minutes daily as well as an additional 15 minutes a day of outside reading.
- ▶ Weekly Reading Log will be due each **Friday**.
- ▶ Memorize addition, subtraction, and multiplication facts!

**If homework is not completed, student may have to work on it at recess or take it home to finish that night.**



# Absences

- ▶ Please make sure your child is in school unless ill. ATTENDANCE COUNTS! Please try to schedule appointments after school. If you are taking your child out of school, please let me know ASAP. Work missed will need to be completed.
- ▶ Homework is due the day after the student returns to school.
- ▶ Missed tests will be given the next day the student returns or when time permits.
- ▶ TARDIES do count against perfect attendance!

  - ▶ Birthday invitations can only be given out before/after school off campus. No invitations will be passed out in the classroom.

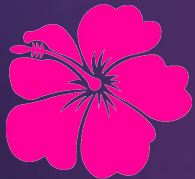




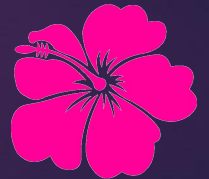

- ▶ Pencils, Paper, Crayons, Glue Sticks, etc.



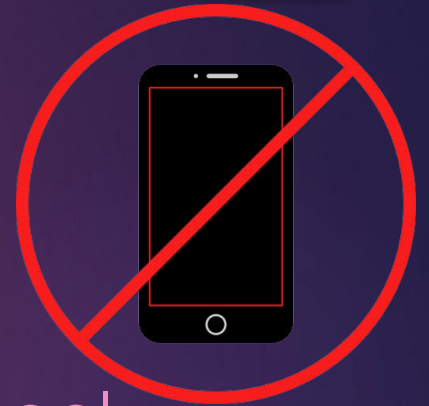
# Classroom Donations

- Parents contact the office to reach your child.



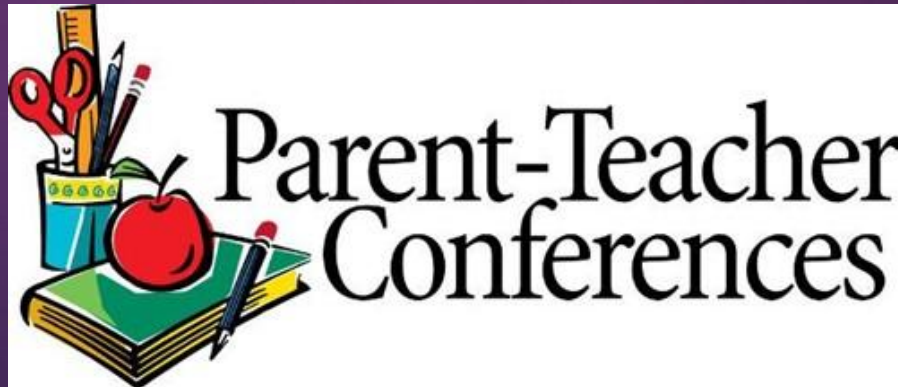
# Dress Code

  - 4) 2 hour after school detention and parent/student conference.

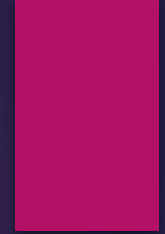

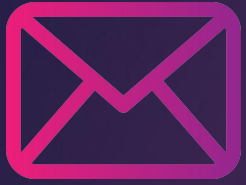
