Classroom Expectations and Grading Policies

Course Description: Health education is a continuum of learning experiences that enables students, as individuals and as members of society, to make informed decisions, modify behaviors, and change social conditions in ways that are health enhancing and increase health literacy.

Individual assignment evaluation:

All assignments will be evaluated using the following criteria:

1. Completion, following instructions, thoroughness, effort
2. Accuracy of information
3. Neatness (including legibility) and organization
4. Projects also graded on Creativity

Extra Credit Policy: Extra credit will be offered in addition to regular assignments. Extra credit is NOT A SUBSTITUTE for missed assignments and is usually built in to projects and assignments. Extra Credit assignments/options are available to all students when offered; however, it is not available upon request.

Make up policy: If a student is absent, the student has one day for each day of an excused absence to make up the work. Make up work is only given for absences that are cleared. Students are responsible for making arrangements with the teacher to receive make up work.

Late Work: All work is expected to be turn in on time. No points will be given for late work. Projects/Reports are to be turned in on the day they are due. If you will not be here send it with a friend, sibling, or e-mail by class time and bring the hard copy without any changes when you return from an excused absence.

Attendance: Regular attendance is expected of every student. Students are expected to be in their seats before the bell rings. All students will be held accountable for their attendance and one's grades often are a partial reflection of their attendance.
