Each student will be completing art projects, along with a weekly sketchbook that will make up the bulk of their grades. Students are required to turn in their assignments on time, and late work will not be accepted. Students with excused absences will receive additional time to complete their work within one week of their absence.

Classwork, participation, and attendance are very important in art class. If students are not in class(On Google Classroom), and have tardy issues, they will miss valuable instruction, and studio time to complete their projects and assignments. It is the responsibility of each student to obtain any missing assignments, and arrange to make up any studio time, aside from regular class time, to finish their incomplete assignments. A positive attitude, good daily performance, and class preparedness are all important to maintaining a passing grade in the class.

Course Description

Art Fundamentals

Art Fundamentals will introduce drawing and painting skills using a wide variety of art mediums including watercolors, pencils, tempera paint, colored pencils, inks, etc. The mastery of materials and appropriate methods will be explored with emphasis on relationships to the art principles, and art elements of design. We will discuss art history, art production, art esthetics (feelings about art), and art criticism (the discussion or evaluation of visual art).

Drawing & Painting

Drawing and painting will introduce students to a higher level of drawing and painting skills that were first introduced in Art Fundamentals. We will continue to work with the basic materials, but also include acrylic paint, print making, and sculpture. We will continue the mastery of materials with emphasis on creative expression, and creative development.

Reference Materials

During the course of the year, the students will be working with visual materials such as reference books, art history books, films, videos, DVD's, and computer sites. These art references may contain paintings, sculptures, and images of the human body. Students are expected to treat such materials in a mature fashion. Student must understand that the human form plays an important part in art, and art history.

Art Supplies

It is important that students maintain their DONATED equipment boxes and store them properly within the given storage area of their class period.

Class Rules

1. No eating or drinking in class. Food and drinks may be consumed during passing periods, and lunch time only.

Mid-Term/Finals

A mid-term will be given at the end of the first semester. It will be an Artist Report about any artist, historical to contemporary in a two page MLA formatted report.

Include the following information:

Who was the artist? Full name. Birth/Death dates (if applicable).

Where was the artist from? Where did they reside?

When was the time period of the artist? Give dates of his art career.

What did the artist produce? What mediums did they use in their art?

How did the artist do within his career? Successful? Posthumous success?

Why did you choose the artist? Briefly explain your answer in a paragraph. Four examples of the artist work will be posted on a page of the report including the following information: Title, Date, Medium used.

Final

A student portfolio will be assembled during the course of the year. Each student will describe 12 assignments from the portfolio in a detailed report. This is a written assignment only.

Sketchbooks

Purchase a spiral bound sketchbook. 4 Sketchbooks will be completed on a weekly basis. One drawing assignment will be given at the beginning of each week. Fridays will be the designated day to complete the drawing assignment. Students may practice the skills, and techniques that they have learned during the week.

Late sketchbooks will not be accepted.

Drawing will be completed inside the sketchbooks.

One additional drawing may be turned in for additional credit each week.
