Course: English 12CP (General Information)

Welcome to our class. Your achievement grade will be based on your progress throughout the semester as measured by the following: Class work, homework assignments, participation, and Tests Essays/Projects. Your achievement grade will be determined by using a point system when grading assignments.

Grading Scale

Your achievement grade is based upon total points earned and the percentages of the total points earned. The scale used to define grades will be as follows:

$$100\% - 90\% = A$$

$$89\% - 80\% = B$$

$$79\% - 70\% = C$$

$$69\% - 60\% = D$$

59% and below = F

45% of your grade is based on Tests/ Projects, 35% of your grade is based on Homework, and Class Work, and 20% is based on journals/QuilltPobble. NO EXTRA CREDIT WILL BE OFFERED, so PLEASE do not expect there will be a last second chance at passing the class. You will have to be able to EARN your grade and MAINTAIN IT, in order to pass.

Student Expectations

1. Be prepared each day in class with the following necessary materials:

- 2. Attendance Your attendance in class is a vital element in the successful completion of the class. Even though you are required to make up any written assignment or test missed due to LEGAL absences, certain experiences such as lectures, discussions, oral exercises, class interaction, audio-visual presentations, and other class activities cannot be duplicated. If you are not present and participating in these activities at least 70% of the time each semester, it will be tough to earn a passing grade. Remember university's DO NOT accept D grades.

If you are legally absent on the day an assignment is due you must turn in the assignment upon your return to avoid scoring 0 points in my grade book for it.
