### Course Information

### **AP Exam Info**

- AP Exams go on sale in September for about \$100
- Exams purchased after November 1 cost \$40 more
- All enrolled students should take the AP Exam
- Students who pass the exam earn 2 semesters of credit
- Ayala AP US History students significantly outperform national average (88% vs. 72% last year)
