

# Chino High School Sports Boosters Annual Scholarships

## Provisions for the Academic Scholarships:<sup>1</sup>

**Purpose:** To encourage and recognize high academic achievement, participation in varsity sports, participation in school and community activities, and to assist with the costs of higher education.

**Eligible Candidates:** Chino High School senior class students who are planning to attend a two-year/four-year or technical college, at least 2 years participation in a high school sport, with at least 1 year at varsity level, and carries a 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher.

**Application Procedures:** Applicants must submit a completed application form, a 500-word essay on the assigned topic listed below, a copy of the applicant's high school cumulative transcript(s) and two (2) letters of recommendation; one from your participating coach and one from a non-elective classroom teacher. Completed applications for this annual scholarship must be submitted to: Renay Prescott, "College & Career Center", by the **deadline of May 15, 2020.**

**Selection Criteria:** The selection criteria will include the following considerations:

- Commitment to attend a two-year/four-year or technical college
- Scholastic achievement
- Participation in a school sport(s)
- Parent/student participation in Sports Boosters
- Participation in club, school, and community activities, and leadership positions held
- Submission of Chino High School transcripts
- Two (2) letters of recommendation; one from your participating coach and one from a non-elective classroom teacher
- Submission of a 500-word essay on the assigned topic:

*TOPIC:* Who in your life has been your biggest influence and why?

## **Number of Scholarships:**

A total of 6 scholarships will be presented at the Chino High School's Scholarships & Awards Night, Wednesday, May 20, 2020. Four (4) selected applicants will receive \$500 each and one (1) will receive \$700 dollars for the Scott Maughan scholarship. There will be one (1) selected applicant who will receive \$1,000. Each scholarship award winner will directly receive their scholarship money upon providing Chino High School Sports Booster with an actual copy of their National Decision Day confirmation for Fall of 2020 or proof of enrollment to a community college.

# Scott Maughan Scholarship Fund

## How and why it was created: (By Larry Walters)

In 1996 a student athlete named, Scott Maughan played Frosh football at Chino High School. I, Larry Walters was the defensive Head Coach at the time. Scott was 1 of only 2 kids to be sent up to Varsity that year. He was the All American Boy. He was polite to everyone, smart, a respected leader, an artist, poem writer and devoted Christian. I still have the articles from the newspapers and from his funeral service. They used one of his drawings and a poem he had written as the memorial. I would be happy to share them with you as well. The last time I saw Scott was the morning he passed away. As I walked past the corner of the locker room we caught a glimpse of each other, we both stopped and exchanged a greeting and short conversation. He was someone that would not pass you without making an effort to engage. I will not tell you what went through my mind in the seconds after I learned of his death. The team came together - there was a common cause to play and be our best for Scott. It was also the best "medicine" for the players and staff. Members of both teams said a prayer on the field after every game that season. The team was inspired and played to a county record of 26 game win streak (combined with previous year) and a difficult loss in the final game. At the awards banquet that year, Mr. Maughan addressed the team and families in attendance. There were tears as he spoke telling us that he did not attend any games as it was too painful not to see his son run onto the field.

There was talk of a Scholarship fund to be established in his name. It has not happened until now. A Memorial was built and placed on the Northern edge of the field where all levels would run by and tap the memorial before they ran on the field. The memorial was removed for the field renovations and has not yet been returned. I have asked for help with this and I am sure his family would appreciate knowing for years to come, that the Chino Community will honor him and a student athlete. I am donating \$350 and Chino High Sports Boosters club has matched my donation. I thank you and the Boosters for your efforts to help the students of Chino High School and surrounding community.
