PROGRAMS

AVID

AVID is an in-school college readiness program for grades 9-12 that prepares students for college eligibility and success.


OVERVIEW

Freshman Year- College requirements/expectations
Sophomore Year- Career Exploration
Junior Year- Testing (SAT/ACT/ECT), University Exploration
Senior Year- College Apps, FASFA, Scholarships

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual Enrollment is a program that allows high school students to enroll in college courses taught by college faculty.

*Courses taken the summer before 9th grade, will NOT be on the transcript.



ACES – Computer Science Pathway

ACES is designed for students who are interested in engineering, computer science, programming, physics and mathematics (STEM) and who desire a hands-on course of study. The schedule of courses includes several Advanced Placement (AP) courses in a required sequence*. All computer science core courses are transferable to partner colleges for credit with a high enough score on the AP or End of Course (EOC) exam. Students in the Computer Science Pathway are also exposed to work-based learning opportunities throughout the sequence. The Academy is rigorous but open for all incoming students who are interested and motivated to apply.

You can also do computer science and still participate in sports, extracurricular activities, band and leadership - we welcome well-rounded students who have the time management skills to manage multiple responsibilities.

Collaboration, Presentation, Projects with team work (not being lectured at), Coding, Technology, Robotics, College Level Experience, AP 5 point grading system (versus non-Ap is four).











ACES – Engineering Pathway

The Engineering Pathway is designed for students that are interested in engineering, computer science, programming, physics, and mathematics (STEM) and who desire a hands-on course of study. The schedule of courses includes several Project Lead the Way (PLTW) courses in a required sequence exposed to work-based learning opportunities throughout the sequence. I courses (IED, CEA,) have articulation agreements with Chaffey College fo year, IED/CEA/POE were eligible for articulation.

The Engineering Pathway is rigorous but open for all incoming students that are interested and motivated to apply. You can also do engineering and still participate in sports, extracurricular activities, band, and leadership - we welcome well-rounded students that have the time management skills to take multiple responsibilities.

*Must meet qualifications for all AP classes.

SPECIAL SPECIAL EDUCATION

"PULL-OUT CLASSROOM"

- Special Education Classroom
- All students with IEPs
- Small group instruction (ideally 15)
 - More individualized instruction
- Teach specific subject matter
 - English, Math, Biology, World History etc
- Teach the same Common Core State Standards as General Ed
- Teachers consider pacing and execution of instructional methods

CO-TEACHING / COLLABORATIVE CLASSROOM

- General Ed classroom with support
 - Co-teaching: two teachers share the responsibilities and support students
 - Collaboration: one teacher and one paraprofessional to support students
- Heterogeneous Population of Students
 - All students are expected to meet Common Core State Standards





All absences must be verified within <u>5 days</u>.




