Anna Borba is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways parents and teachers communicate all year are:

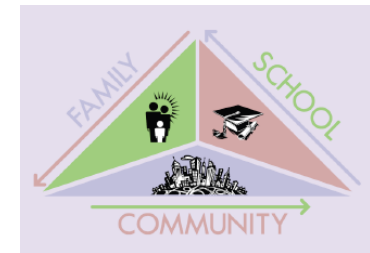
- Weekly homework agendas or folders

## Teachers, Parents, Students—Together for Success

### In the Classroom

The Second grade team will work with students and their families to support students' success in meeting or exceeding the CA Common Core State Standards. Some of our key ways to connect our classroom practices with the school goals will be to:

- All students will have an opportunity to present on a specific topic.
- Develop Math automaticity by administering timed tests twice a week to practice addition/subtraction.
- All students will learn the 6 Character traits to enhance school safety.

### At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

- Review sight words
- Timed fluency passages
- Discuss with your child the different books they bring home to read. Ask questions that relate to the story.
- When your child responds, encourage the use of complete sentences.
- Read to your child daily (English and bilingual books).
- Read and tell stories in your native language.
- Re-do and practice the Math timed tests.
- Discuss and demonstrate the Character Traits of the month at home.
- Attend school-side events and parent-teacher conferences.
- Attend ELAC (English Language Acquisition Committee) meetings.
