IM3H Class Syllabus

This course is California Common Core State Standards based. Standards for this course have been set forth by The Department of Education, State of California. Students will be responsible for mathematical content and standards in prerequisite courses and/or previous semesters. All students and parents are responsible to ensure that the prerequisite courses were taken and passed.

The prerequisites for this course are an A or B+ in both semesters of Integrated Math 1 and Integrated Math 2 Honors at Ayala High School or an equivalent course. This course is more challenging and has higher expectations than a regular Integrated Math 3 class and is designed to support and prepare students to take AP Calculus AB next year.

It is critical that each student is a self-directed learner; does all homework problems and reviews notes every night.

Materials

- 1. Chromebook to bring every day.
- 2. A notebook <u>specifically</u> for math (a 1 inch binder or a notebook with openable rings is okay)
- 3. Graph paper (to have on hand)
- 4. Pencils/erasers
- 5. Pens (various colors are suggested to help with note taking)
- 6. Ruler/straight edge
- 7. Scientific and Graphing Calculator
- 8. Highlighters
- 9. Glue sticks/tape (optional)

Homework and Classwork

Homework will be assigned every class and is due at the beginning of the next class period. All homework will be kept in your notebook. Homework answers will be available online on Google Classroom for students to review and correct *before* coming to class. Homework will be stamped and graded on completeness as well as being in the correct format. Students must show all work or justifications to receive credit. **NO WORK=NO CREDIT.** Students are also responsible for keeping all graded work in the event a score is inputted incorrectly. **Homework must be legible to receive credit.**

Late Work

Any assignment that is not present on the day/time of collection is considered late on the day of the unit test. Late work will only be accepted with an oops/homework pass. Assignment must be 100% complete in order to use an oops/homework pass.

Interactive Notebooks

We will be using interactive notebooks this year which will help students develop strong note-taking and study skills. The notebooks will be collected and graded on the day of the unit test based on the rubric which will be provided to each student. Students are responsible for keeping all notes for each semester.

Tests and Quizzes

There will be at least 1 test and (possible) quiz for each unit that we cover. These are not only used to measure student learning, but also to help students develop strong study skills that will transfer to other classes as well as their post-secondary education. Each test is weighted the same and each quiz is weighted the same regardless of the number of questions. A quiz is ½ of what a test is worth. There will be a comprehensive final exam each semester (worth two unit tests). After each test or quiz has been graded, it will be passed back to the students for review. Since this is an honors course, <u>no test corrections or retakes will be allowed</u>.

How to check your grade

It is the student's responsibility to monitor their grades and bring any issues or discrepancies to my attention immediately so they can be corrected or resolved. Parents and students are strongly encouraged to check the **Aeries Parent Portal** on a weekly basis to view the most current grades for EVERY class and to have an updated e-mail address on file with the office.

If you are absent...

- You will have up to as many days as you were absent to turn in missed assignments. (For instance, if you were absent on a Monday, you would have to turn in absent work no later than Wednesday)
 - Students are responsible for showing absent work to Mrs. Allen
- Tests and quizzes will need to be made up the day you return regardless of how many days you were absent.
- There will be no postponement for students who are absent days prior to a test or quiz.
- Students are responsible to copy notes from a classmate for the day(s) they are absent as well as checking my website for any handouts or videos that may have been posted.
- All homework, worksheets and notes will be posted on Google Classroom daily.

Academic Honesty

Cheating of ANY kind will result in a score of ZERO on the homework assignment, test, or quiz. If a student is found with another student's homework assignment (or picture of), both students will receive no credit without exception. Talking of any kind, having unauthorized materials (including personal electronic devices), or "wandering eyes" are considered cheating. (Refer to student handbook for more information)

Classroom Rules

Every student has the right to a positive and safe learning environment.
