Academic Goal

To provide a 21st century learning experience while ensuring content mastery, we use computer technology during instruction in all academic areas, including many of the technological components included in the adopted curriculum.

Non-Academic Goal

- We will use positive praise, rewards and parent communication.
- We will also encourage peer to peer positive communication.
- We will use the Second Step behavior program to provide additional positive behavioral support to our Scholars.

At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

Academic Strategies


- Read with your child for a minimum of 15 minutes a day. Ask questions to check for understanding. For example, who are the main characters, what is the conflict, how is it solved, what happened in the beginning, middle and end.
- Provide a quiet, distraction free homework area with all necessary materials.
- Check your child's agenda and homework nightly.
- Communicate with your child's professor if you have a question or concern.
- Allow your child to access the online educational programs, such as IXL, Reading Eggs, Pearson Math, and Wonders.

Non-Academic Strategies

- Make illness the only excuse for an absence
- Communicate with your Scholar's professor if you have a question or concern.
- Reinforce behavior expectations: Be Respectful, Be Responsible, and Be Safe.

English Learner Strategies

- Encourage your Scholar to speak and write in complete sentences.
- Read aloud with your student in both English and their native language each day.
- Read bedtime storybooks in English.
