Volunteering Opportunities



School Goals

<u>Goal 1</u>

100% of grade level or department teams will respond with intervention and extension for at least 3 CFAs with Tier I and Tier 2 instruction, as measured by artifacts showing intervention & extension plans by the end of the 2023-2024 school year.

100% of grade level or department teams will clarify for students the Essential Standards to engage students in understanding what they are learning and how they will know when they have learned it.

<u>Goal 2</u>

By May 2024, Rhodes Elementary will receive an overall score of 84% on Tier 2 implementation, as measured by the Spring External TFI.

By May 2024, Rhodes Elementary will reduce chronic absenteeism below 20% for all student groups, including homeless, African American, and 2 or more races.

Goal 3

On the 2023 CAASPP, the percent of students scoring "Standards Met" and "Standards Exceeded" (combined) in ELA will increase from 72% to 75%, and in Math will increase from 67% to 70%. All significant student groups, including Special Education and English Learners, will increase by at least 5 percentage points.



At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support Scholars' success:

- Have your child write for a variety of purposes (making the grocery list, writing letters or notes to family and friends, draw a picture and write a story to go with it.)
- ✓ Read with your child each day.
- Ask your child to explain what they are learning in math and practice different strategies for solving problems.
- Practice speaking and answering questions in complete sentences.
- ✓ Reinforce the school expectations at home: Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe.
- ✓ Make sure your child gets plenty of rest. Students between the age of 5-12 need a minimum of 8 hours of sleep each night. Create nightly bedtime routine and monitor screen time.
- ✓ Ensure that your child maintains excellent school attendance.
- ✓ Communicate with your Scholar's professor if you have a question or concern.
- Attend as many school events as possible, especially parent/teacher conferences and Back to School Night.
- ✓ Read all school communications (email, website, Parent Square, etc.)

English Learner Strategies

- Encourage your Scholar to speak and write in complete sentences.
- Read aloud with your student in both English and their native language each day.
