In the Classroom

As a Kindergarten teacher, I will engage all students with a vibrant learning climate and high-quality instruction. Listed below are some of the student learning strategies your child will use this year.

<u>Goal #1:</u>

- ✓ Whole group and small group instruction in reading, writing, and math
- \checkmark many opportunities to read, write, draw, and talk
- ✓ Use of Thinking Maps
- ✓ Provide students with I can statements, success criteria, and frequent feedback.

<u>Goal #2:</u>

- ✓ Reinforce PBIS strategies
- ✓ Use Second Step curriculum daily
- Keep an open communication line with parents and ensure all students are utilizing school agendas.
- Provide parents and students periodic feedback on progress and performance.

Goal #3:

- ✓ At least 15-20 minutes of daily Designated English Language Development instruction (DELD).
- ✓ Strategies used for oral language development, such as pair share, visuals, and read-alouds.
- ✓ All students will speak/write in complete sentences.
- ✓ Utilization of sentence frames for speaking.
- ✓ Use of Thinking Maps
- \checkmark Write with capitalization and punctuation.
- \checkmark Opportunities to read and write in class daily.

At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

- Talk with your child everyday about school
- Support children with homework as needed
- Ensure your child is in school, on time, everyday
- Report absences to the school as soon as possible
- Read to or have your student read (depending on ability) at least 30 minutes each night.
- Help your child organize school belongings
- Check your child's school agenda each night
- Attend as many school events as possible, especially parent/teacher conferences and Back to School Night.
- Have your child speak to you in complete sentences.
- Read all school communication (email, website, Parent Square, etc.)
- Practice basic addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division facts (depending on grade level) each night.
- Practice grade level site words each night (primary grades).
- Monitor your child's screen time and ensure healthy eating habits and sleep time.
- Play board games which encourage language development and vocabulary along with social family time.
