

More Measure G projects approved

The Chino Valley school board on Thursday approved several construction projects that will be funded by the \$750 million Measure G bond approved by voters in 2016.

Installation of playground equipment at Anna Borba Elementary in Chino cost \$8,600 more than expected after a 4-inch leaking mainline was found and repaired by contractor John Buck dba J2 Builders during construction.

The \$106,200 contract ended up costing \$114,800 with the change order.

Country Springs and Butterfield Ranch elementary schools are next to receive new playground equipment.

The board awarded the same contractor a \$151,800 contract for Butterfield Ranch and a \$174,100 contract for Country Springs to remove and install new equipment on both kindergarten and elementary playgrounds.

A new safety and security intercom system at Wickman Elementary in Chino Hills, costing \$31,597, was installed by Upgrade Time & Alarm Systems.

Work is complete on asphalt and concrete repair at the Allegiance STEAM Academy charter school site in Chino. The job cost \$172,950. Allegiance leases the campus from the Chino Valley school district.

Interim housing needed for students during modernization work is complete at Cattle Elementary in Chino and Litel and Oak Ridge elementary schools in Chino Hills. Fifteen portable trailers were placed at Cattle. Litel and Oak Ridge elementary schools each received seven.

The Chino Valley Adult School in Chino has a new marquee costing \$22,355. Encore Image was contracted for the project, which was funded through means other than Measure G.
