Attendance

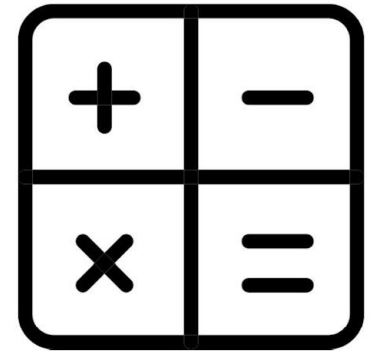

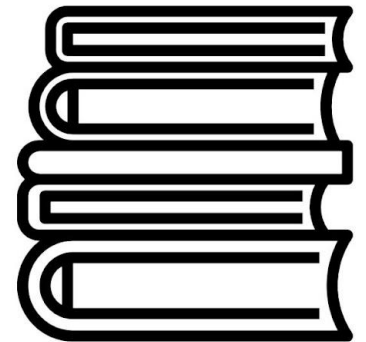

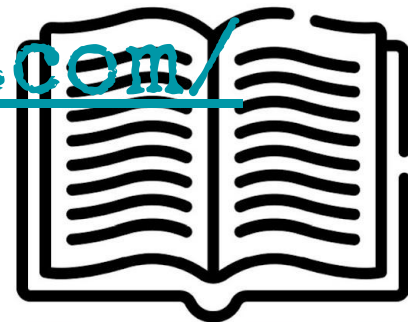

donating these items:

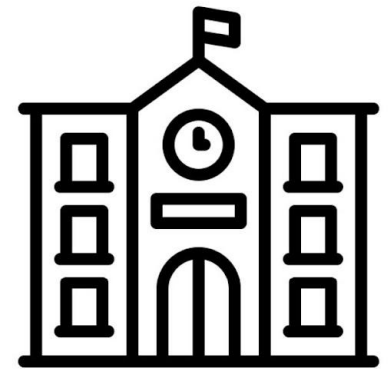
- Band-aids
