Course Description:

The History-Social Science course of study is a guide to the eras and civilizations to study. These standards require students not only to acquire core knowledge in history and social science, but also to develop the critical thinking skills that historians and social scientists employ to study the past and its relationship to the present. It is possible to spend a lifetime studying history and not learn about every significant historical event; no one can know everything. However, the State Board hopes that during their years of formal schooling, students will learn to distinguish the important from the unimportant, to recognize vital connections between the present and the past, and to appreciate universal historical themes and dilemmas.

General Class Rules:

Materials and Supplies:

Missing Assignments and Late Work:

Students that have an (un)excused absence are not exempt from any assignments, homework, or classwork assigned or due on the day of the absence. It is the **student's** responsibility to inquire about any missed assignments the day they return from their absence. All assignments will be posted on Google Classroom. The last day to turn in any late work is the Thursday before 12-week, 18-week and semester grades are due. All late work will receive a 30% deduction no matter how many days late the assignment is. *Participation cannot be made up. Homework will not be accepted as Late work.*

Participation:

There is a zero Opt-out learning policy. Everyone must participate. Failure to participate will result in loss of points. Participation will take place during class meetings in multiple forms. Participation may include: volunteering, cold calling, participating in group discussions, participation though live activities (polls, discussion boards, map activities, raise of hands) etc... *You may not always know the answer, but effort shows you care and are trying.*

Grades:


To succeed in this class, complete ALL assignments! Grades are calculated by dividing the total points earned by the total points possible.

Exams and Quizzes:

The majority of quizzes will be conducted in class on Fridays and will be peer graded same day in class. All quizzes must be taken with a **BLUE** or **BLACK** pen only. Immediately following the quiz, the quizzes will be collected and redistributed in class for peer grading. This allows for immediate feedback and checks for understanding. Additional assessments and exams may include multiple choice questions, short answer responses (who, what, where, when, why, and significance), essays, verbal video presentations or project. You will be responsible for knowing materials from ALL sources, lecture notes, homework assignments, discussions, films, etc...

Exam and Quiz Make-Up Policy

The Make-up exam will not be the same as the original test or quiz. An appointment must be made with Ms. Parrell to take the make-up test within 1-week from the day you return after missing the test or quiz.

Cheating will not be tolerated-

Essays and random assignments will be submitted through a program checking for plagiarism. Plagiarism- “the practice of taking someone else's work or ideas and passing them off as one's own.” Cheating will result in an automatic zero grade. The same applies for classwork, homework, quizzes and exams.
