

Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals - Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)

All students are provided a high-quality teaching and learning environment.

All students are prepared for college and career beyond graduation.

School Goals

Goal 1: 100% of grade level teams will respond with intervention and extension for at least 3 CFAs with Tier 1 and Tier 2 instruction, as measured by artifacts showing intervention & extension plans by the end of the 2022-2023 school year.

In the Classroom

As a fourth grade teacher, I will engage all students with a vibrant learning climate and high-quality instruction. Listed below are some of the student learning strategies your child will use this year.

GOAL 1: Students will be able to cite textual evidence, describe literary elements in depth, clarify words/phrases used in a text, verify authors point of view, and compare literature and informational text.

GOAL 2: Students will be able to write a wellstructured, multiple-paragraph text based on a literary or informational text or of particular genre with a clear perspective.

GOAL 3: Students will be able to develop, apply, and demonstrate the understanding of multi-digit multiplication and division; the equality, addition, and subtraction of like fractions; and classifying geometric shapes.

At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

- Look through the Rustler folder every Monday.
- Daily practice with multiplication and division facts.
- Check homework for accuracy.
- Help your child prepare for tests.
- Talk to your child daily about their progress in school.
- Communicate with your child's teacher regularly.
- Have your child read 20-30 minutes daily and ask questions about their reading.
- Attend school-wide and parent education events.
- Take your child to community events.
- Talk with your child about your expectations for their future goals (i.e. college and/or career).
