Academic Goal:

At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

- Look through their Rustler folder every Monday.
- Practice and play alphabet sound games.
- Practice sight words
- Recite nursery rhymes.
- Play games using rhymes, syllables, and segmenting and blending sounds.
- Read 20 minutes a day with your child and discuss what was read.
- Find fun ways for your child to write and practice penmanship.
- Talk to your child everyday: ask who, what, when, where, how questions
- Sing with your child.
- Stay involved in the parent-child activities that come home.
- Encourage your child to be respectful, responsible, and safe.
