Here are some brief descriptions of a few of our partnerships to showcase the breadth and depth of our HOPE community partners:

Focus on Youth (FOY) Collaborative meets monthly and is committed to 1) • annually assess community need and 2) seek out funding to implement, sustain and/or scale youth services. Since its inception in 2000, FOY has generated more than 25 million in grant funding to serve youth. FOY provides an umbrella of accountability for HOPE, McKinney-Vento CARE and other youth programs. Committee members represent various agencies including CVUSD, YMCA, prison facilities, police departments, community and faith-based organizations, service clubs, neighboring counties and LEAs, and the cities of Chino, Chino Hills, and Ontario.

- Verve City Church- Founded in 1991 as Inland Hills Church, Verve City is committed to the life-giving message of Jesus, the passion and joy of weekly worship gatherings, and a simple but effective approach to discipleship. This is reinforced through intentional investment in local communities through both financial sponsorship and community service. Verve City Church has shown consistent support to CVUSD and several social service programs including replenishing the Community CARE Closet and providing food/ pantry home deliveries to case management families facing food insecurity. The church works alongside community organizations and city officials to share the love of Christ in a real way by serving others.
- The Faith-Based Collaborative is co-chaired by the Chino Police Department and the City of Chino Community Services Department having a two-fold mission: 1) to enlist the support of local faith-based organizations in the event of a disaster and 2) to bring groups together to assist with community need. The collaborative meets quarterly to highlight current community needs and service opportunities.
- California Institution of Men (CIM) and the Chino Valley Employees' Association (CVEA) consist of employees and the institution sharing a common goal of helping others within the facility AND the local community. In partnership with CVUSD's HOPE Program, CVEA's Board coordinates & executes community-based events including student/family holiday sponsorships, fundraising/clothing campaigns, and community outreach and education.
- Shoes that Fit, a local non-profit, tackles one of the most visible signs of poverty in America by giving children in need new athletic shoes to attend school with dignity and joy, prepared to learn, play, and thrive. Program case managers assess need, take the correct shoe size, and submit a referral to Shoes That Fit. Shoes are picked up within the week and distributed directly to students. CVUSD and Shoes That Fit have partnered for 20 years assisting hundreds of students each year.
- Chino Valley Fire Foundation (CVFF) provides monetary assistance, gift cards, holiday sponsorships, and emergency funds for unaccompanied and homeless students and their families. CVFF has organized clothing drives for the CARE Closet and promoted the drives as a competition between schools with prizes and visits from firefighters to the winning sites. Additionally, local firefighters work closely with the HOPE Program to donate personal time and resources to assist MV-referred families with housing inadequacies, e.g., plumbing, roofing, etc.
- Chino Valley Released Time Christian Education (RTCE) is a non-profit 501c3 organization serving the area since 1998. Security-cleared volunteers teach students in 3rd through 6th grades (with parental permission) about the love of God on 22 elementary school sites. RTCE has partnered with the HOPE Program for nine years providing gift cards for clothing and gas/transportation, hygiene/personal care items, and emergency monetary assistance via a benevolence fund.
