Why Partner?

Faith communities can be valuable partners for LEAs because they often:

- Have existing relationships with students and families within the community
- Reflect a heart to serve others and meet tangible needs
- Can provide regular weekly or monthly volunteers
- May offer financial assistance or host donation/collection drives for needed items
- Have existing programs or referral networks in place to help families in need
- Want to be engaged in the community around them

How to Reach Out

- Find people with heart for the community.
- Get leadership on board.
- Show why your work matters to the community, to your families, to the academic success of students.
- Share how their contributions make a difference. Show why it matters that they join in.
- Share student stories, respecting confidentiality, that bring need to human level and show potential positive impact.
- Find the right fit. Everyone is good at doing something. Instead of trying to do everything, find the right fit and the best ways for others to contribute.
- Communicate clear expectations, policies, and timelines to ensure a positive experience for everyone.
- Invite others to contribute in the planning process and to bring their ideas, creativity, and skills.


