#### **Course Description**

We will be analyzing and responding to themes, form, and techniques in literature. We will be reading exceptional texts that may challenge and/or confirm how and what we think in our everyday lives. My goal as your teacher is to encourage and empower each of you to become exceptional learners both in and out of the classroom.

#### **Tardy/Discipline Policy**

Students are required to come to class prepared and on time every day. Students will be marked tardy if they are not in their seats ready to learn when the bell rings. Students that are not prepared or misbehave during instructional time will receive the following:

#### **Independent Reading**

Students are required to bring a reading book to class daily, and complete weekly check-ins. Students will read 30+ minutes per night at home, per school policy.

Late assignments will be accepted but may not be turned in after the end of the unit of study in which they were assigned. Students may retake any test or quiz in which they received below 80% within a week. They may earn up to <u>80%</u> on their retake. If a student is absent, they can find the agenda and assignments in Google Classroom.

#### The Outsiders Novel Reading Permission

Dear Parent or Guardian,

During the 2024-2025 school year, your student will read the novel *The Outsiders* by S.E. Hinton. It is published by Scholastic Books and recommended for ages 12 and up. We will be reading the novel in class, but students are welcomed to purchase their own copy at a local bookstore if they would prefer so they can write in their own annotations.

The language and details of the novel derive back to the 1960's. The novel is about a 14-year old boy named Ponyboy and his struggles with right and wrong in a society where he believes that he is an outsider. The Outsiders is about two groups of teenagers who rival each other because they come from different socioeconomic backgrounds.

The Outsiders unit will consist of class discussions, activities, and assignments that encourage critical and creative thinking. Your child will be encouraged to reflect upon the reading and discuss the author's use of characterization for the characters and their actions based on the stereotypes assigned to them by themselves and others. In addition, analyze how stereotypes affect society still today.

Due to some topics discussed in the book such as gang related violence and family dysfunction, some may consider it to be too mature for 7<sup>th</sup> graders unless a parent or legal guardian grants permission. I have personally read the novel and feel it is appropriate for our class. This novel has been selected by the district because of its literary and thematic worth. The mature content works to enhance the meaning of the text and will consequently promote a higher level of learning and understanding. However, I still wish to have your consent.

Students whose parents do not indicate permission or those students who do not return the parent permission form will read an alternative novel.
